School News

Summer Reading Reminder

All students in grades 9 – 12 are required to complete summer reading assignments. All assignments are due to the office no later than Tuesday, August 10th. (Students who transfer after July 13th may turn in their assignments prior to September 17th.) Students received a detailed explanation of the assignments before leaving on summer break. All students (except AP English students) must choose two of the following choice novels

- *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night* by Mark Haddon
- *Castaway Kid* by R.B. Mitchell
- *Feed* by M.T. Anderson
- *When the Emperor Was Divine* by Julie Otsuka
- *The Namesake* by Jhumpa Lahiri

It is the responsibility of the student to check these novels out of the library or purchase them. After reading, students must complete a journal assignment for one novel and a movie poster for the other novel. Details of the requirements for these assignments can be found in the handout distributed to each student in May.

In addition, students in advanced classes have an additional novel to read. Those students enrolled in Advanced English II must read *Their Eyes Were Watching God* by Zora Neale Hurston (available at the school) and complete the novel specific assignment, and those students enrolled in Advanced English III must read *Blindness* by Jose Saramago (not available at the school) and complete its novel specific assignment.

Students enrolled in AP English have four novels to read and four assignments to complete. Their novels (all available at the school) are *Cold Mountain* by Charles Frazier, *Brave New World* by Aldous Huxley, *The Handmaid's Tale* by Margaret Atwood, and *How to Read Literature Like a Professor* by Thomas C. Foster. The assignments associated with these novels were also distributed to students enrolled in the class prior to leaving on summer break.

Athletic News – What You Need to Know!

Sports Fees

The sports participation fee for the 2010-11 school year will be **\$75 per sport for high school** and **\$50 per sport for junior high**. There is a maximum fee of \$300 for families with multiple children at Catholic Central Jr/Sr High. The CC Athletic Department has a “**no pay, no play**” policy. **Fees need to be paid prior to the first competition**. Checks can be made out to CC Athletic Department and sent to school (attention: Athletic Department).

Physicals

Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) requires all athletes to have a physical prior to participation in athletic events. The physical form and the OHSAA Authorization form can be found on our school's website (www.ccirish.org). Physicals are good for one year and athletes can go to their own doctor to get the form completed. **Physicals and the OHSAA form are required to be turned into the Athletic Department in order to participate.**

We are currently looking for doctors and nurses that may be willing to provide free physicals for our athletes during the summer in exchange for service hours. If you can help out with the physicals, please contact Dan Shay at extension 115.

Student Athletic Passes

The Athletic Department will be selling student passes (CC students in grades 1-12) this year for \$50, senior passes for \$75 (age 62 and above), and adult passes for \$125. These passes will be good for admittance to all home sporting events (including CYO) throughout the entire 2010-11 school year. State tournament games that we might host are not included. The passes can be purchased in the Athletic Office during the school day.

It's Gold for the Irish!

Springfield Catholic Central's Swimming and Diving Team Ranks 10th in Nation

It doesn't seem to matter if Catholic Central swimmers are in or out of the pool when it comes to success! The National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association (NISCA) in conjunction with Speedo has selected this year's all-stars in aquatics.

The Catholic Central Girls' team was honored with the Gold Scholar Team Award with a combined GPA of 3.820, ranking 10th in the nation. The award is based on the average cumulative GPA of an entire team of 12 or more athletes.

The three levels of recognition are:

Bronze Level 3.200 – 3.499

Silver Level 3.500 – 3.749

Gold Level 3.750 – 4.000

To receive the individual Academic All-American distinction, a student athlete must have a **GPA of 3.75** or better, be a graduating senior, and have lettered in their high school swim program during their senior year. **Four Catholic Central swimmers have received this prestigious honor. The Academic All-Americans are: Brian Bourke, Kathleen O'Connor, Dennis (Sam) Sheehan, and Andrew Sullivan.**

Central's Patrick Greitzer, with a breaststroke time of 58.26, was awarded All American status.

Nationally, only the top 130 athletes in each event are named All-Americans. Additionally, over 289,000 students in the United States are involved in aquatics at the high school level. Approximately 2% of these students are recognized as high school All-American's.

Catholic Central Boys' had a 9-man team, and therefore, could not be considered for the Scholar Team Award. However, we congratulate them on their academic and athletic success. The teams were coached by Mrs. Connie Koehler and Mr. Bruce Patmos.

Emerald Evening Successful!

On April 24, Catholic Central held its 17th Annual Emerald Evening Gala Auction. It was a lovely evening of friends, food, and fantastic items to purchase. Edible cake centerpieces were created by Katherine Weeks and they were delicious. Jennifer Sheehan won the Emerald Necklace provided by Goldesign and Mary Venrick was the top winner of \$2000 on the "Money Tree Raffle" sponsored by The Field Family.

Other major sponsors were The Kurian Family, Dr. Maxwell & Staff, Community Mercy Health Partners, Ohio Valley Medical Center, Whitacre's Pharmacies, The Demana Family and an anonymous donor of two full scholarship equivalents. The event netted just over \$100,000 which will be used to provide tuition assistance for the upcoming school year.

Annual Fund

Our fiscal year ends June 30th and we are very close to making our goal of \$225,000. It is not too late to make a gift and help us get over the top. These funds provide teacher salaries, technology updates, and helps fill the gap between tuition and the actual cost to educate a student.

At a minimum wage rate of \$7.25 per hour, that's \$52,410 of service to the school. The premise of service hours is to RAISE or SAVE money for the schools and you can see how effective this program is to Catholic Central Schools. A special "Thanks" to everyone who choose to get involved. This helps keep tuition lower and it keeps families in touch with the students, their friends, and other parents. It also is a great way to model service to others as an important part of our school's culture.
