Re-enrollment and Enrollment:

- **Current PK-12 Families: Please do not complete NEW APPLICATIONS FOR the 2024-2025 school year. Your re-enrollment packet is located on your FACTS Family Portal.** If you have not set up your RenWeb account, please do so as re-enrollment will require access to your account.
- PK-12 New Student Enrollment 2024-2025 is open.
- Families who have a hold on their accounts will need to attend Enrollment Night 1/31 from 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm OR call the office to make an appointment to come in to re-enroll.

K-12 Incentives



- “Bring a Buddy” Incentive: Any family who brings a new family to CC who is accepted for the 24-25 school year will receive an adult athletic pass for the 24-25 school year.
- January 5 to January 31 is early registration for returning families if you enroll K-12 student(s) during this time you will receive \$200 off of one K to 12 registration fee of \$250. Families will also receive this incentive if they come on January 31 for Enrollment Night on 1/31/24 from 5 pm to 7:30 pm.
- February 1 to March 28 early registration. Families will receive \$100 off the \$250 for one K-12 registration fee.
- March 28 to June 1 \$50 off the \$250 for one K-12 registration fee

PK Incentive:

- All preschool families who re-enroll/enroll by Feb. 29, 2024, will receive \$25 off of the \$100 registration fee.

Business Office:

CEF (Catholic Education Foundation) Scholarship - The deadline to apply is Feb. 25th. Awards are for PK-12 tuition in amounts up to \$1,200. The award is income-based and the income max is 649% of the Federal Poverty Level/FPL (in 2023, 649% of the Federal Poverty Level = \$194,700 household income for a family of 4). CEF can be paired with other scholarships (including EdChoice) to minimize the amount that families have to pay out of pocket. Our goal is for every family to apply - there's money available for all. If you're having trouble completing the application, we can help. Call the school office at 937-325-9204 for more information.

EdChoice - Believe it or not EdChoice forms are out for the 24/25 school year! Please stop in or contact the office so they can let you know if you need a request or a renewal form as new rules have changed things up a bit. Please fill out one for each student and return it with an up-to-date utility bill that shows both the service and mailing address.

If you are below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level please complete the online income verification process with the state and upload your 2023 tax return, 2023 W2's, or your last four paystubs. If you still need to do this online, you will need to create an OHID account. The office can help if you have any issues. If the state says you fall within the guidelines then you will not have to pay the difference between the amount of tuition and the Scholarship amount.
